Mr. W. Y. Pettit, on behalf of the Building Committee of the church, then presented the Grand Master with a beautiful specimen of the silversmith's handiwork, which bore the following inscription:—

PRESENTED TO

M. W. Brother Daniel Spry,

Grand Master A. F. & A. Masons of Canada, by the Churchwardens of St. Jude's Church, on the laying of the corner stone of the above church, on the 18th June, 1883.

The M. W. the Grand Master having graciously acknowledged and accepted the gift, the cement was spread, and the upper stone was lowered, with three halts, at which intervals the band played bars of the National Anthem.

When it had been guided into its proper place, the principal Grand Officers applied the plumb, rule, level and square, and having reported that the stone was just, true and properly laid, the Grand Master struck the stone three times with the cavel, and said:—Well made, truly laid, true and trusty. May this undertaking be conducted and completed by the craftemen according to the Grand Plan in peace, harmony, and brotherly love. Corn, Wine and Oil were poured upon the stone with symbolical explanations, and the Grand Master entrusted to the architect and builders the tools and plans with which to complete the building.

The M. W. the Grand Master then delivered an address to the brethren and citizens present, followed by addresses.
