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ST. HYACINTHE BURNED.
Business Section of the City Completely Destroyed By Fire.
Two Thousand People Are Homeless—The Property Loss Estimated at Over a Quarter of a Million Dollars—Three Hotels and a Lot of Business Places Destroyed.

ST. HYACINTHE, Que., May 20.—A fire which broke out shortly after noon today in the office of the mayor, destroyed that and half a dozen other business buildings, and 350 houses, leaving nearly a quarter of the city's population homeless tonight. The loss is placed at \$400,000. Nobody knows how the fire started. When it was first noticed it had secured a firm grip on the office building, and the flames were spreading in all directions. The fire was extinguished after a long and hard fight, but the damage was done.
