

The four-masted schooner Gypsum Emperor is ashore and in peril near New York, according to a dispatch from Boston. The Gypsum Emperor was bound from a Nova Scotla port with lumber for New York and is owned by F. C. Lockhart, halling from Windsor. Built at Parrsboro, in 1892, she has a registered tonnage of 695 tons, while her displacement is 744 tons. Captain Cottam is the commander. Last summer the Gypsum Emperor was at the Canary Islands with lumber, sailing thence to a port in the southern United States.
