WOULD ASSESS FOR THE BRITISH SOLDIERS RELIEF

Commissioner Russell suggests that it be included in Next Year's Assessment.

Mayor Hayes presided at the committee meeting of the Common Council at noon yesterday. All the commissioners were present with the exception of Commissioner McEwen. It was decided to recommend to the Council that repairs to the West Side wharves at an estimated cost of \$8,500 be made.

Commissioner Wigmore brought up the matter of replacing the three-inch main on Hanover street with an eight-inch main at an estimated cost of \$400, and moved that the committee recommend that the work be done. Carried.

Commissioner Fisher reported that after looking into the matter of developing the Tucker Park he had decided not to go ahead at present as a complete survey would cost \$1,000. He will ascertain if a portion of the \$10,000 given by Miss Tucker might be used for that purpose.

Commissioner Russell introduced the question of a grant to the British Soldiers' Relief Fund and suggested that it be included in the assessment next year.

Mayor Hayes thought that the Council should do something even if they let other matters wait. The matter will be brought before the Council in the form of a resolution at an early date.

ANNUAL MEETING OF HOME FOR INCURABLES

Twenty-six Patients Now in the Institution—Reports of Officers and Boards.

The annual meeting of the subscribers to the St. John Home for Incurables was held yesterday afternoon. Reports were read from the board of management, treasurer, auditor, women's auxiliary and the medical board. The report of the board of management showed that at the beginning of the year there were thirty patients in the home, sixteen males and fourteen females. Nine were accepted. Ten patients died during the year; three patients were removed, leaving in the home twenty-six patients. This report was submitted by Dr. Thomas Walker, president.

The treasurer's report submitted by F. B. Ellis, showed that the capital funds of the home now are \$12,305.85, other moneys in the treasurer's hands being \$7,269.28, making the total holdings, on all accounts, \$19,575.13. Revenue account showed a balance, as at July 10 last, of \$1,344.85; July 12, this year, donations \$165; by annual members, \$12; interest, \$4,588.94; paying patients, \$4,316.50—total, \$11,137.09. Expenditures for the year were \$8,171.34, leaving a balance on hand of \$2,965.75, an increase of \$1,731.10 over the amount on hand at the time of the last annual meeting.

The auditor's report, brought in by P. F. Blanchet, certified to the correctness of the accounts kept by the treasurer.

A very interesting report was presented by the secretary of the committee of the women's auxiliary, Miss Lillian Hasten, showing the good work accomplished by the auxiliary during the past year.

The report of the medical board, submitted by Dr. T. F. Dunlop, showed that during the year ending July 19 nine patients had been admitted to the home and that ten deaths had occurred. During the same period two patients were removed to the hospital for tuberculosis, and one patient by request; twenty-six patients are at the present time in the hospital. The attention of the board was called to the advisability of having additional room for the isolation of advanced cancer cases.

The old board of directors was re-elected. R. B. Emerson occupied the chair.

115TH BAND PROVIDED GREAT MUSICAL TREAT

Band Concerts on King Square Yesterday Afternoon and Evening Enjoyed by Thousands.

Fully five thousand people enjoyed the excellent programmes of music furnished on the King Edward band stand, King Square, yesterday afternoon and last night by the band of the 115th Battalion. This talented organization of musical artists, under the direction of Bandmaster Milton Perkins, has certainly developed into one of the leading bands in Canada, and there was not a moment during the afternoon or evening programme that was not fully enjoyed by the immense crowds of people who had the opportunity to hear present. The most difficult selections were handled in a manner which showed that every one of the bandmen was an artist, the harmony, and the rich tone from the instruments, donated to the band by James F. Robertson, and the masterly manner in which every number on the programmes were carried out, brought forth nothing but the highest praise from some of the best musical critics in the city. Every number was received with loud applause, and the programme was indeed a musical treat.

While the members of the band are New Brunswickers, the majority are citizens of St. John, and every one has had years of experience either in local bands or orchestras. Bandmaster Perkins is a resident of West St. John, and when there was a call for recruits was bandmaster of the 62nd Regimental band. The members of this band, who could pass the medical examination, enlisted in a body, and with recruits from other bands, it has developed into an organization of which the city is proud.

For some time the band has been with the regiment at Valcartier, and arrived in the city a few days ago in full force. This short stay expires today, and as the band expects to soon go overseas, they will not be back to St. John for some time, they decided to give the citizens some entertainment before saying farewell. It was only arranged to give a concert yesterday afternoon, but when the request was made to the bandmaster they kindly offered to give a second concert in the evening, for which the citizens are duly grateful.

The concert in the afternoon was a new idea, but proved a grand success, especially for women and children. It drew one of the largest crowds seen on the King square for years, and only went to show that the afternoon band concert is fully appreciated. In fact, had the concert been advertised, the crowd would have been even larger than it was, as many citizens were unaware that there was to be a concert.

The attendance at the evening concert was very large, and the space around the band stand, the walks, and sidewalks surrounding the square, held thousands of well pleased people. In all, during the afternoon and evening, the band rendered over twenty selections, and citizens will long remember the 115th band.
