New Bill Before Legislature Proposes Sweeping Reforms Over Existing Laws—Proposed Tax Measures of Provincial Treasurer Come in For Criticism.

[Special to The Advertiser.]
Toronto, April 4.—Surprising and unaccustomed alacrity was displayed by the Ontario Legislature today in dealing with the numerous public, private and Government bills that came up for consideration. A score of measures were advanced a stage, some given a third reading, some a second, and others committee approval. About a dozen of the bills that were dealt with in today's business-like session were Government bills.
