PRINCE OF TECK DEVOID OF 'SIDE'

Has Real Business Capacity and Made Name for Himself in Boer War.

Pluck, business capacity, geniality, and good nature are the chief characteristics of Prince Alexander of Teck, who is to succeed the Duke of Connaught as Governor-General, when the latter's term of office expires in October next.

In the army the "Tommys" loved him because he had no "sides," and knew his business. As a fellow-officer put it, when he went out with the Prince's regiment, the Seventh Hussars, and first saw active service in the Matabele war in 1896, "he was not a military clothes-horse, but one who knew what soldiering meant." He was no shirker "roughing it," and he took risks with the most reckless of our soldiers out there, being on

several occasions mentioned in despatches. A striking illustration of his Royal Highness' enthusiasm for soldiering is illustrated by the fact that when the South African war broke out the Prince at once volunteered for immediate service, and within forty-eight hours sailed with the Inniskilling Dragoons, who took part in the operations round Colesberg, the routing of General Cronje, the relief of Kimberley, and the march to Bloemfontein. Of one of the Prince's South African fights an interesting story is told. An Australian war correspondent who rode towards one of the khaki-clad

regiments was approached by a young unassuming man, who was anxious to hear news from the outside world. "Have you been under fire?" he asked the correspondent. "I should smile," was the reply, "and I don't much appreciate it. Anybody that likes it can have my share." "We have to go under fire whether we like it or not," said the quiet young Englishman. "At a salary," chirped the cornstalk. The young man shrugged his shoulders and walked away. Then the Australian heard that the unassuming young soldier was Prince Alexander of Teck, and he went back

in the direction from which he had come. That, however, was just the Prince's way. Says one who met him during the war: "I once travelled half a day with him, not knowing who he was. Then I learned how earnest a soldier the Prince is, and how thoroughly wedded to his profession. He is a good tracker, and a good camp man, too." As a boy, before he went to Eton, the Prince spent his days at Kensington Palace, where, with his two brothers and sister, Queen Mary, he romped and ran like a merry sand-dog. He was her Majesty's favorite, and it was a black day when he first

went off to school—a "preparatory" for Eton, for, in spite of the seven years' difference in their ages, the sister and brother were constant companions. At Eton the Prince was known as a good-tempered, jolly fellow, very fond of games, a reputation which he has always maintained. The business enterprise and capabilities of Prince Alexander were displayed when he carried on the task of raising funds for the Middlesex hospital, begun by his brother, the late Prince Francis of Teck, four years ago. In this work he was largely assisted by his wife, Princess Alexander, who devoted a great deal of

time to practical philanthropy. Indeed, few big charitable enterprises have been launched in which she does not have a personal interest. A daughter of the late Prince of Wales, and a sister of the Duke of Saxe-Coburg, the Princess Alexander of Teck married when she was 21 years of age.
