of 1877. Sat for St. John (county) in N.B. Assembly from 1861 to g.e. 1866, when defeated on Confederation question, to which he was opposed. Was a mem. of Ex. Council, N.B. (in the Smith Administration) for a few months, 1866. Has sat for Gloucester in the House of Commons since the Union. Returned by acclamation at the g.e. 1874; re-elected in 1877, on resigning his seat under Ind. of Parlt. Act, and at last g.e. Elected Speaker 25 March 1874. Retained the Speakership until the close of session of 1877, when Committee of Privileges and Elections reported his seat vacated in consequence of a breach of the Independence of Parlt. Act. The report was not adopted, but Mr. Anglin resigned. Re-elected Speaker, 7 Feb. 1878, which position he held until dissolution of Parlt. A Liberal—Waterloo Street, St. John, N.B.

ARKELL, THOS. (Elgin, East.)

S. of Henry Arkell, Esq., and Mary Arkell, of Gloucestershire, Eng. Came to Canada in 1832, and settled near St. Thomas, Ont. B. in Gloucestershire, Eng., 1825. Ed. in Can. M., 1st, 1855, Misss Morgan, Tp. of Yarmouth (she d.); 2nd, 1864, Miss Urlin, of City of London, Ont. (she d.) Was Mayor of St. Thomas for seven years. Has been connected with Municipal Councils, in one capacity or another, for the last twenty years. Contested East Elgin in 1875 for the Ontario Assembly, and was defeated by Dr. Wilson by a majority of twenty-four. First returned to Parlt at last g.e., defeating Colin McDougall, Esq., the late mem., by a majority of forty, out of a vote of 4,300. Conservative, and in favour of the N. P.—St. Thomas, Ont.

BAIN, THOMAS. (North Wentworth.)

S. of the late Mr. Walter Bain, of Denny, Stirlingsbire, Scot, who came to Can. 1837, and settled in West Flamboro', Ont. B. in parish of Denny, 14 Dec. 1834. Ed. in Can. M., 25 June, 1874, Helen, second dau. of John Wier, Esq., of West Flamboro'. Was for several years Reeve of the township of West Flamboro', and in 1870 Warden of Wentworth. First returned to Parlt. for present seat at g.e. 1872; again by acclamation at g.e. 1874 and re-elected at last g.e. A Reformer.—Strabane, Ont.
