CHAP. I.

An Act to Regulate the Commercial Intercourse between this Province and the United States of America, by Land and Inland Navigation.

[Passed 7th March, 1820.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the Commercial Intercourse Preamble.
between this Province and the United States of America, Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,'" and by the authority of the same, That the following articles, of the growth, produce and manufacture of the United States of America, may, during the continuance of this Act, be imported into this Province from the territories of the said United States of America, on payment of the several duties respectively affixed to the same, Certain Articles may be imported from the United States on payment of the duties herein mentioned.
that is to say:—

- Cable and Tarr'd Rope, per pound, two pence.
- Cordage Untarred, per pound, two pence.
