13. Thick and cloudy. Arrived a canoe from Savahina with fresh herrings a present to our chief. This being Sunday went to prayers as usual.

14. Frosty weather. Employed as usual. Invited to eat

salmon spawn, after that whale's blubber.

15. Fine and clear. Our chief's wife out gathering bramble berries. Arrived a canoe with six natives from Airizarts with ifraw for our chief; he gave in return cloth, &c.

16. Frosty weather. Natives fishing. Arrived a canoe from Chewmadart with a large chest of salmon spawn for our

chief.

17. Invited to eat dried salmon and train oil.

18. Natives Fishing. Our chief's wife returned.

19. Rainy weather. Invited to eat sea cow's blubber. Arrived a canoe from Aitizarts with ifraw for our chief.

20. Natives fishing. Arrived a canoe from Aitizarts with

ifraw for our chief.

21. Fine and clear weather. Our chief went to a small village; returned with two baskets of dried salmon.

22. Frosty weather. Invited to eat dried clams and train oil.

23. Arrived a canoe from Esquates with six hundred weight of blubber, being taken from a whale that had been driven ashore in a gale of wind.

24. Rainy weather. Arrived four canoes, one from Savahina, and three from Aitizarts. Our chief had a large feast and a dance; after the dance was over the chief gave away to the amount, muskets two hundred, two hundred yards of cloth, one hundred chemises, one hundred looking glasses, and seven barrels of powder.

25. Fine and clear. Natives fishing, &c.; plenty of fresh

herrings.

26. Frosty weather. I was out fishing for herrings; returned with a canoe full.

27. Rainy weather. This being Sunday went to prayers.

28. Clear weather. Invited to eat whale's blubber. Natives fishing. Arrived a canoe from Ah-ow-zerts with skins.

29. Clear weather. This day our chief informed us that he was going to war with the natives of Columbia's Cove, and that I must make some daggers out of old bolts. I went to work with my fire made of green wood, without any bellows, and a large stone for my anvil.

30. Employed making daggers; finished one which much

pleased our chief.
