**The belching 5002 roars into town**

A print from the picture of old Erindale Station, painted by Earl Dick of Clarkson from a photograph taken by Bill Carr of O'Hagan Drive, Erindale Woodlands in 1920, is on the nostalgic, historic 1969 Christmas card of the Erindale Community Hall Board.

The picture itself, the fourth of a series, now hangs on the panelled wall of the lower Hall.

It was much admired by members of the Erindale Women's Institute, meeting there Dec. 3. Their hall board representative Miss Anna Burke sold many cards which are only \$1.50 a dozen.

The snapshot was brought to light through the Mississauga News. In this column, Nov. 20, 1968, we

told of the year-long fruitless search for a picture of the old station.

Mr. Carr, a "camera bug" when a young man,

lived on No. 10 Highway with his family, had a snapshot of the station, complete with old train. He loaned the picture to the Hall Board for this Christmas card.

The station master on the platform would be the late Albert Doerr. In 1923 he married a popular, pretty Erindale girl and teacher of Erindale School, Miss Bessie Crozier, now of Streetsville, a member of the pioneer Crozier family.

**SUPER-SHOCK**
