Re Kitsilano Reserve.

I have your letter of February 29th. You need have no fear nor apprehension that the Department will fail to obtain the best possible price for the Kitsilano reserve. It is our understanding with the British Columbia Government, which will be embodied in the Orders in Council, that the reserve is to be sold after public advertisement, and this is strictly in line with our understanding with yourselves. There is a memorandum before the Governor General in Council now in this matter and when it is passed I shall take up the necessary arrangements for advertising, etc., etc. I do not think that there is any necessity of having another valuation of the reserve, and Commissioner Ditchburn agrees with me.
