was a disreputable woman, but,
efforts were made to reclaim her,
and, I have been led to believe her
earnest and sincere, - but, it is
thought she has again fallen, having
returned to this City against my
advice.

The Council desire her to be
removed from the list of the Six
Nations

8th, Mr. Loft and wife, with their
children, are to be divided on the
list, he having failed to provide
a home for her.

9th, A peculiar case, in respect
to Mrs Johnson and wife, she
being of the Mississaugas of the Credit,
but not reported by him, though
married, as he asserts she would
leave her house without his consent.
The Council decided not to at present
recognise the wife, as the husband
made no such request to have
her placed: It is very awkward
for the Young Women, but, it
appears, she with the weakness of
her parents, have so placed her-
self.

10th, Simon Walker and wife, - he, proving
false in his statement of marriage &c,
is disallowed, and, he to refuse

11th, Another case of a white wife
