EWIDENCE OF DAVID DONALD WILSON, D.D.S.

I have known Dr. Wilson fairly well for a few years, and he has apparently gone out of this way to lead me to believe that he was my friend. It was therefore with profound amazement that I read his evidence on Page B-917, in which he says that he tries not to have anything to do with me because he knows that I am trying to cut his throat.

Dr. Wilson's answer to that question in the face of his apparent friendlieness to me, is perhaps explained when one comes to consider the evidence he gave before your Commission in connection with Dr. O'Sullivan. I quote from Dr. Wilson's evidence on Page B-915: "At that time Dr. O'Sullivan was a cripple; he was absolutely N.G.: he had had a very severe stroke that was caused by a syphilitic condition (presumably of the syphilis) but he was not able to function."
