Clause 23. Strike out the whole clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:-

"23. Where the execution of an order, or the carrying out of a decision of a Tribunal, involves the doing of any act which by any statute requires the leave, sanction, assent or approval of the Board of Railway Commissioners, or where in the opinion of the presiding officer of a Tribunal composed of not more than three members the public interests involved are of sufficient importance to warrant it, no order made by a Tribunal shall be operative without the concurrence of the presiding officer and his formal written assent, and on such concurrence and assent having been given, no such leave, sanction, assent or approval of the said board will be required."
