Ottawa, 18th. May, 1910.

Madam; -

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of 12th. instant transmitting a copy of a resolution passed by the Woman's Baptist Home Missionary Society, relative to evils resulting on Vancouver Island from certain marriage customs prevailing among the Indians.

In reply I am not aware that the Department can do better than send you a copy of a communication recently addressed to the Secretary of the National Council of Women in connection with a closely kindred resolution adopted by them, which it is thought will furnish full information in the matter.

It may be added that the Department with a view to imbuing girls with that self-respect which is one of the first steps towards correcting the most objectionable marriage customs more or less prevalent, is establishing a Home for their training at Alert Bay, from which excellent results are confidently anticipated.
