I beg to inform you that on the 3rd June Mr Agent Mann was written to and informed that before this man's application could be taken into favourable consideration it would be necessary to ascertain whether or not his statement that he did not apply for half-breed scrip accorrect. The Agent was asked to furnish the names of the man's parents, and to carefully assure himself that the man's name as given is oppectly spelled.

the Agent's reply. He appear to have considered himself justified, upon the information which he received, in paying imagences and his family annuity for 1802.

Under the edroumstances it is considered that he exceeded his authority although the man may be justly entitled to the payment. You will observe that the Agent asks to be allowed to pay arrears for 1901. I shall be glad if
