



Ottawa, March 24, 1914.

Rev. Sir,-

I have to inform you that the Department has been in communication with the Dominion Entomologist, who has been authorized to purchase enough fruit trees for an orchard of one acre to be laid out at the school under your charge. I have to request that you will be good enough to have an acre of ground prepared for the reception of these trees, which will be forwarded to you by Mr. T. Wilson, Inspector of Indian Orchards, Vancouver, B.C. These trees will be paid for by the Department and the only expense the school will be put to will be for the preparation of the ground and the care of the trees. It is thought that this will afford an excellent opportunity for the pupils of your school to become familiar with the care and management of fruit trees.
