Army. He thought the Germans might even attempt to set up a Polish Government in Warsaw, but that if they found a Polish Quisling he would be murdered. The General told me some astonishing stories of the killing by Polish patriots of Nazis, sometimes in broad daylight without apparently undue interference; he gave as an example the murder of the notorious Kurt Hoffman. He added that sabotage by Polish patriots was on the increase, causing grave disruption to railway and other communications.

10. The General informed me that he was in constant touch by wireless with the elements of resistance in Poland; in fact, it was possible for him to send a message and receive a reply the same day from clandestine wireless stations there.
