Summary of Evidence in the case of L-120741. *Rfr*
Fitzgerald, J. H., Headquarters Canadian Counter
Intelligence, C.A.C.

By direction of the Commanding Officer, the evidence
is taken on oath.

First Witness - C. 23757. Pte. (a/cpl) Ouellet, R. G.
Transport Sgt., Headquarters Canadian Counter Intelligence
sworn, states:-

I am Sgt. Ouellet, R. G. and I issued a
statement in the Transport Office on Monday morning
previous to the accident, that the jeeps would be frozen
in the evenings and on Sundays except on the occasion
of a work ticket signed by Capt Duddy. There is a guard
posted whereby all vehicles must check out and in.

Cross-examined by the accused.

Q. Was I present at the time the statement was issued.

A. Yes.

Second Witness - D-63721, Pte. Ladouceur, R. ^{Divisional} Head-
quarters Canadian Counter Intelligence, C.A.C. sworn,
states:-

R. Ladouceur
N.A.C. I am Pte Ladouceur R, and on the afternoon of
26 Sep 45, I, with *Rfr* Fitzgerald went to my
room, where we met *Rfr* Umpleville and the three of us
drank a considerable amount of alcohol. He then went
to supper. After supper *Rfr* Umpleville and I were sup-
posed to hitch-hike to Rotterdam. He came back to our
room and *Rfr* Fitzgerald met us there. He drank about
two glasses of alcohol each. He then decided to change our
plans and bring two girls with us. About 1800 hrs I
went to the garage and took the jeep, M. 6183910, without
authority. He left for Rotterdam accompanied by 2
girls from the mess hall, during this trip I drove the
jeep. We arrived at our destination in Rotterdam and
went into the house and had several drinks. I then
gave the lead (high tension cable) and the rotor to
Rfr Fitzgerald. *Rfr* Umpleville and *Rfr* Fitzgerald
then left with the 2 girls. I stayed in the house where
I spent the night.
