Monarch Broadcasting Co.	Medicine Hat, Alta.	1000 watts on 1270 kc. with directional antenna.
<p><u>Reason:</u> The applicant had authorization for 1000 watts provided that a frequency could be found. The technical brief was satisfactory.</p>		
J. O. Blick and E. B. Osler	Winnipeg, Man.	Change in frequency assignment from 1230 kc. to 1340 kc.

Reason: It is necessary in order to avoid side channel interference with the St. Boniface station on 1250 kc.

IT WAS RESOLVED

THAT the Minister of Reconstruction be advised that the Board of Governors of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation recommends that the following applications be denied for the reasons indicated:

(a) Changes to Existing Stations:

<u>Station</u>	<u>Location</u>	<u>Request</u>
CKFX (short-wave)	Vancouver, B.C.	Power increase from 10 watts to 100 watts and move from Lulu Island to 543 Seymour Street, Vancouver.
<p><u>Reason:</u> It has been the Board's policy since its inception in 1936 to oppose power increases for privately-owned short-wave stations.</p>		
CKNW	New Westminster, B.C.	Power increase from 250 watts to 1000 watts and change frequency from 1230 kc. to 860 kc. or 1270 kc.
<p><u>Reason:</u> Neither frequency is available and moreover this station was originally licensed as a local community station.</p>		
CJCT	Calgary, Alta.	Power increase from 100 watts to 1000 watts on 610 kc. with directional antenna.
<p><u>Reason:</u> The use of 610 kc. is technically undesirable as CJAT Trail, B.C. on the same channel is only 212 miles away.</p>
