SCHEDULE D.

Goods on which there shall be levied a rate of one shilling and three pence per ton gross weight:—

Anchors,—Anvils,—Alum,—Chains,—Metals of all kinds, in Pigs, Bar, Bolts, Rods, or Sheets,—Hollow Ironware,—Plough Moulds,—Nails,—Spikes,—Shot,—Stoves,—Ores of all kinds,—Chalk,—Cement,—Gypsum,—Plaster of Paris,—Whiting,—Copperas,—Grindstones,—Millstones,—Dye-woods,—Soda-Ash,—Raft Gear,—Bran,—Shorts,—Luggage,—Bones,—Hoofs,—Horns.

SCHEDULE E.

Goods on which there shall be levied a rate of one shilling per one hundred gallons thereof:—

All Liquors, Wines, Oils and Fluids whatsoever, in wood or other packages, except bottles.

SCHEDULE F.

Goods on which there shall be levied a rate of nine pence per ton measurement of forty cubic feet:—

Earthenware, Stoneware, Chinaware and Glassware, in packages.

SCHEDULE G.

On all Goods, Wares and Merchandise whatsoever not otherwise classed or described, there shall be levied a rate of three shillings and four pence upon every one hundred pounds of the value thereof: Provided always, that upon Goods, the value of which cannot be ascertained satisfactorily, it shall be lawful for the Harbour Commissioners to levy a rate of one shilling and three pence per ton weight or measurement, as they may see fit.
