September.—Considering the very great value of parsnips, it is surprising they should be so little cultivated. The seed is slow to vegetate and may be advantageously sown in the fall, and then in the spring they will be among the first to shoot forth. The seed is rather improved by winter burial. They should be sown wide enough apart to afford space for working the ground that will have become sodden or pressed down by snows and rains. On the island of Jersey parsnips are said to yield from thirteen to twenty-seven tons to the acre—sufficient to support twelve cows for six months. Parsnips contain six per cent. more muchage than the carrot. Animals will grow fat thus fed. There is the advantage of leaving a part of the crop in dry ground during the winter.
