HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion ands in Manitoba or the North-west Territories, excepting 8 and 50, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide weed tost for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is thus sole heat of a family, or any male over 18 years of ask, to the extens of inequarter section of 100 area, not or territorial manifest and the section of 100 area, not or less than of mequarter section of 100 area, not or less than of mequarter sections of the section of 100 area, not or less than of the section of 100 area.

Entry may be made personally at the loca land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interio, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipes, or the Lacra-Agarctic anticority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestcad is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:—

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is cligible to make a homestead entry upon the provisions of this hard entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to upsidence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in themanner pre-scribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2) (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector, the sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector, the sub-Agent or the Homestead Partition of the Sub-Agent of the Homestead Partition of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his Intention to do so.
