Okalahoma today presents a social and political situation which has had no parallel in this country since Civil War days. There is no compromise in sight. Although Colonel William H. Key, military director of the city, has seized the police depart-ment from Mayor O. A. Cargill and ousted Chief of Police Ray Frasier and Night Chief Nelson, there is enparently no dimension on the part and right only helpoin, there is apparently no disposition on the part of any public officials whose resigna-tions have been demanded to yield up their powers to the governor.

There has yet been no great out-burst of public opinion over the rule of the military and in some quar-ters it is openly asserted that on the issue of "Down with the Whippers." Governor Walton will ride into the
