fouth-east side of said bay, thence along faid road and the rear of the same lots to the division line between numbers fixteen and Eventeen in the back fettlements, and along that line to the reat of the King ston lots, and along the rear of the King ston lots to the town of Suffex.

The fourth town or parish to be called, known and distin- Kirghin. guish'd by the name of King ston, beginning at the point where the first described line of the town of Westfield strikes the northwest shore of Kennebeckacis Bay, and bounded on the south-west by faid line, on the north-west by the upper line of the county, to the commencement of the town of Spring field, thence along the boundary of the same town till it strikes the line of the town of Suffex, at the faid grant to Studbolme, Baxter, and others, and thence along the boundary line of the same town of Suffex, to the place of beginning, including Darling's Island, and Long Island.

The faid county called Queen's County, shall be divided into Towns or pasifour towns or parishes, as follows, to wit: the first town or parish the in Section of the in Section to be called, known and distinguish'd by the name of Wickham, Wieliam. on the east side the river St. John, bounded southerly by the lower county line, westerly by the river Saint John, to the lower bounds of Lieut. Col. Spry's lands, northerly by a line running from the faid lower bounds of faid land north fifty-four degrees east, thirty miles, easterly by a line running from said extent fouth; thirty degrees east, until it strikes the lower county line, including the lower Musquash Island.

The second town or parish to be called, known and diffin- Watabases. guish'd by the name of Waterborough, on the east side the river Saint John, bounded foutherly by the faid town of Wickham. eafterly by the continuation of the back line of the same town of Wickham, north thirty degrees west, until it strikes the upper county line, northerly by faid county line, and westerly by the river Saint John.

The third town or parish to be called, known and disting Hompfled. guish'd by the name of Hampstead, on the west side the river Saint John, bounded foutherly by the lower county line, easterly by the river Saint John, to the division line between Nathaniel Jarvis's lot number thirty-eight, and George Sweet's lot number thirty-seven in the Gage-town grant, northerly by said division line to the rear of faid lots, thence by a line running fouth fiftytwo degrees west to the easterly line of Charlotte County, and westerly by Charlotte County, including Long-Island, Upper Musquash Island, and Spoon Island.

The fourth town or parish to be called, known and distin- Gagarar. guish'd by the name of Gage-town, on the west side the river
