A Message from the Legislative Council, by Mr. Smith, Master in Chancery :

Mr. Speaker,

The Legislative Council have passed the Bill, intituled, "An Act for declaring Judges to be disabled, and disqualifying them, from being elected, or from sitting and voting, in the House of Assembly," without any amendment. And also,

The Legislative Council have passed the Bill, intituled, "An Act further to continue the Acts therein mentioned, for making a temporary provision for the regulation of Trade between this Province and the United States of *America*, by land or inland navigation," without any amendment.
