from the sale of Land formerly set apart for the support of Grammar Schools, and not alienated by the authority of His Majesty's Government; the accounts of the Board under whose control the School Reserves have been hitherto placed, will be delivered over to the King's Receiver General at the close of the year. In this instance of consideration of the King, in complying with the prayer of the Address of the House of Assembly, you will perceive the solicitude of His Majesty to promote the wishes of the Province.

It will be for you to decide upon the practical mode of applying to the intended object, the School Funds; and whether it may not be more desirable to appoint a Commission to carry into effect the measures of the Legislature, in regard to the distribution of the proceeds of these Lands, than to dispose of them by annual vote. Whatever course you may deem it expedient to pursue, it will be gratifying to me to concur in Petitions brought such enactment as may appear best calculated to secure the interests of the people.
