of Eighteen thousand dollars; and from the Normal School Building Fund, for the Government House at Montreal, the sum of Eight thousand dollars; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.

8. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Forty thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray Expenses for Rents, Insurances, and Repairs of the Public Buildings;

for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.

9. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One hundred thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, viz.: - For Colonization Roads of Upper Canada, the sum of Fifty thousand dollars; and for Colonization Roads of Lower Canada, the sum of Fifty thousand dollars; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.

10. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Nine thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for completion of the Matapedia Military Road; for the financial year ending

30th June, 1867.

11. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Ten thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray Expenses for the Monck Military Road; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.
