

Brantford Cleaned Up Both Holiday Games

Morning Affair Went Eleven Innings—Nichols Showed Fine Stuff in the Afternoon When Red Sox Won 2-1 Victory

Coming back with a vengeance the Red Sox, after two hard fought battles defeated the Petes in a double header on Dominion Day, capturing the morning game by the close score of 6 to 5 after an eleven innings session, where Gero replaced Chase in the tenth, and the afternoon session by another close score of 2-1, Nichols pitching his team to victory. McPartlin and Reed umpired both games satisfactorily. There was a fair attendance at both games.

Morning Game.

Chase and Cresswell opposed each other in the morning, with Matty Lamond and Miller behind the bat. So far as getting hits go, the Red Sox more than doubled their opponents, as they got to Cresswell for 12 bingles to the Petes 5 hits, four of which were off Chase, one off Gero who replaced Chase in the tenth innings. A peculiar thing about the runs made by the Petes was that of the five, four were unearned, one being on an error, one from a "hit by pitcher," one on a wild pitch, and another from a walk. Only one was reaped in from a real hit. The Petes scored their first two in the second when Blount and Thraikill came in. A home run by Gaby Ivers in the third put the Red Sox one in the lead, but Blount and Kelly scored in their half of the innings, Blount being walked and Kelly being hit by the ball. The fourth and fifth were quiet sessions for both teams, Lamond and Chase striking out in the fourth, and Long getting the only hit for either side in the fifth. In the sixth King scored for the Petes on a wild pitch by Chase, after Chase had walked Fox

The eleventh was a quick spasm for the visitors who went down, one, two, three. Fox striking out. Three hits and one run were garnered in by the Sox in the 11th. Burns, Deneau and Ivers each getting a bingle and Gero scoring.
