Moved by Mr. Charles B. Howard seconded by G. O. Hayes, that W. J. Moore be instructed to cover the stone on township line, expense not to exceed \$20. Carried.

Moved by G. O. Hayes, seconded by Ezra Earl that the collector's return be laid over until next meeting. Carried.

Moved by Thos. G. Howarth, seconded by Ezra S. Earl that the clerk be authorized to call for tenders for crushing 1000 cords of stone in the township, tenders to be in to the Clerk April 15th. Carried.

Moved by Charles B. Howard, seconded by G. O. Hayes that Lots 20, 21 and 22 in con. 8 be incorporated into road division No. 5. Carried.

Moved by Charles B. Howard seconded by G. O. Hayes that the council adjourn until April the 24th if not sooner called by the Reeve. Carried.
