THE FEEDING OF FARM STOCK.

READ BEFORE EVANGELIST ORANGE BY DR. J. S. FULLER. In discussing this subject I shall say nothing concerning the raising calves, the feeding of cows, horses, swine or poultry—either of which is a fit subject for a much longer article than I have either time or inclination to give you this evening—but shall endeavor to throw out a few ideas as to the profitable management of a few steers taken at one year old and made ready for the butcher by the ordinary farmer in our own locality.

Now, although dike pasture for yearlings may be advantageous in some instances, for the majority I think a first-class mountain pasture the most economical. In the autumn give them the run of the dike, commencing to stable early, in a warm but well-ventilated stable which shall be well cleaned and littered twice each day and left out long enough to prepare their stables for them except occasionally on very fine, warm days when an hour's stiring will be very acceptable. They should be carded at least once a day and fed about five times in every twenty-four hours, all of which should be done regularly at stated times every day and with as little worrying as possible.
