THE ORATOR AND THE NEWSPAPER.

Compare the orator, one of the boldest vehicles of the diffusion of thought, with the newspaper, and we may gain a quiet glimpse of the ubiquitous power of the latter. INTERESTING EXPERIMENT.—Two hundred pounds of earth were dried in an oven, and afterwards put into a large earthen vessel; the earth was then moistened with soft water, and a willow tree, weighing five pounds, was placed therein. During the space of five years, the earth was carefully watered with rain water, or pure water. The willow grew and flourished; and to prevent the earth being moved with fresh earth, or dust blown into it by wind, it was covered with a metal plate, perforated with a great number of holes, suitable for free admission of pure air only. After growing in the earth for five years, the willow tree was removed, and found to weigh one hundred and sixty-nine pounds and about three ounces. The leaves which fell from the tree every autumn were not included in this weight. The earth was then removed from the vessel, again dried in the oven, and afterwards weighed; it was discovered to have lost only about two ounces of its original weight. Thus one hundred and sixty-four pounds of lignin or woody-fibre, bark, etc., were certainly produced within the air.
