**OLEOMARGERINE**

While oleomargarine is comparatively a new food product, not having been discovered until 1870, its use has grown by leaps and bounds, until it is estimated at the present time the world's annual consumption amounts to from 1,600,000,000 to 2,000,000,000 pounds.

The factories in which it is produced are models of cleanliness and sanitation and the manufacturing process is handled under the supervision of government inspectors, whose business it is to see the factory premises and utensils are kept clean and the processes of manufacture are sanitary and that only wholesome and suitable materials are used.

The materials are: Oleo oil (an oil pressed from choice beef fats), neutral (a somewhat similar product made from the leaf fat of the pig), vegetable oil (either cottonseed or peanut oil refined to a salad quality) and milk products (comprising milk, cream and sometimes butter, according to the grade of oleomargarine produced). Each of these materials in some form or other is in use in every household, every day, and no question is raised regarding its wholesomeness or food value. Surely, they are as wholesome and as good food when combined as when separate.
