The market gives indications of greater activity, and in this respect it is not singular, as the principal markets of Canada and the States are also growing brisker. The receipts of Fall Wheat here are extremely light, not more than two or three loads having offered in the course of the past week. The price has gone up in consequence, until it now stands at \$1.65. The business in spring wheat is also getting more lively, although the deliveries are as yet comparatively light. The price which was unsettled during the last few days, is now steady at last week's quotation, \$1.40. There is a very light supply of barley, with keen competition at 75c. Peas and oats are brought in sparingly, the former bring 6 cents more than last week, the latter maintain the old figure, 45c. Pork has become very active. The number of hogs brought in is very large, and increases every day. The tendency in pork is upward, it having risen slowly but steadily during the last few days.
