He told Mrs. Quinn of his discovery and Wednesday morning sha was at the bedside of her husband, reproaching him for sending her no word of his whereabouts. Quinn was formerly engaged as a teachor on Hart's island, where he was messenger in the office of Warden McNamara in the almshouse.
