

This Is the Type of Fortress German Artillery Must Silence to Cross Belgium



The sketch indicates how singularly efficient are the small forts guarding the Belgian cities on the River Meuse, such as Liege and Namur. The fortification is of concrete, in the extreme cen of which is set the gun turret. This turret is capped with a hem isphere of chrome nickel polished steel. It is calculated to make a shot of the utmost velocity richochet; of which is set the gun turiet. The observation towers and still be fortified.
