By WALTER HAGEN. When I take up my task of defending the British open championship at Troon the year before last, I was not playing the part of a stranger in a strange land.

This will be my fourth visit to Great Britain, and I am now a fairly old hand at championship play over there. There are few in the field that I do not know personally. When I won last year at Sandwich I thought that I detected a different feeling among the players and the gallery toward me and the other American entrants.

The taking away of my championship was not such a tragedy as it was the year before last. I was not a champion. Perhaps they had been led to expect the return of the title.

This year the scene of the championship is laid at Troon in the very heart of a wonderful golfing country. Golf is a religion with these hardy Scots. They do not look kindly on intrusions. When in Scotland three years ago Lord Northcliffe told me that it made no difference whether I was an American or an Englishman winning the title, he meant by this. We have the same sectional feeling in the United States. The East likes to beat the West and the West glories in defeating the East. One who loves to boast of his athletic talent as a matter of fact.

Someone asked me recently what preparations I had made this year toward winning again in Great Britain. I said that I had filled up before, and I would not care to go abroad feeling that I had to change my game or my clubs in order to win. I am not a golfer, but I think this would be a handicap that could outweigh any good that could come of it.

I carry about twelve clubs as a rule, and I have no intention of changing this time. In fact, I would need it quite as much as I need it now. I have no intention of changing my game or my clubs in order to win.
