"In the matter of keepynge posies freshe, it is well to keep them in the shayde while gatherynge, and to snip they're stemmes before placynge them in water all hastille."

So says an old, yellowed pamphlet on the "Raisynge and Care of Floueres," whose quaintly worded and spelled instructions would puzzle the modern flower-grower quite as much as enlighten her. 
