The company had expected from shareholders, notes n payment for shares to the amount of 0,000, but these could not be realized on as there was no by-law in the comany's constitution that empowered the nanagement to borrow on the stock of pacco an amount sufficient to pay ne expense of grading and processing. Mr. Ivey stated that he had prepared by-law for the consideration of the reholders, which he read and which gave the management absolute power o borrow on the security of the stock and plant a sufficient sum from time




