by the Government of the United States. The New-York Indians are now so far civilized as to have a Republican Government of their own. There are young men in that Nation who would do honor to any position in the arrangement of a Government for the Indians.—The Chippeway Nation has a great number of well educated young men. The Stockbridges, Oneidas and Shawnees, all these have been blessed with a partial civilization.

Many other reasons might be given besides the above. I will close now, and in my next I will speak of the benefits which must accrue to the American Government and to the Indians.
