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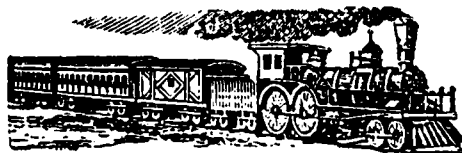

RECRUITS are now being engaged at MONTREAL, OTTAWA, QUEBEC, HALIFAX and ST. JOHN.

Applicants must be between the ages of Twenty-two and Forty, active, able-bodied men of thoroughly sound constitution, and must produce certificates of exemplary character.

They must understand the care and management of horses, and be able to ride well. The term of engagement is five years. The rates of pay are as follows:—

Staff Sergeants, \$1.00 to \$1.50 per day. Other Non-Com. Officers, 85c. to \$1.00

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1st year's service,	50c.	—	50c. per day

3rd "	50	10	60 "
4th "	50	15	65 "
5th "	50	20	70 "

Extra pay is allowed to a limited number of blacksmiths, carpenters and other artisans.
