A new article is to be included in the text of the Convention reading:

"I. Each State Party to this Convention which finds that actions of any other State
Party constitute a breach of the obligations assumed under articles I and II of the
Convention, may lodge a complaint with the Security Council of the United Nations.

Such a complaint should include all possible evidence confirming its validity as well
as a request for its consideration by the Security Council. The Security Council
shall inform the States Parties to this Convention of the result of the investigation.

2. Each State Party to this Convention undertakes to cooperate in carrying out any
investigations which the Security Council may undertake on the basis of the complaint
received by the Council."

Draft Security Council Resolution "The Security Council,

<u>Highly appreciating</u> the desire of a large number of States to subscribe to the Convention on the prohibition of the development, production and stockpiling of chemical and bacteriological (biological) weapons and on the destruction of such weapons,

Bearing in mind that under article ... of the Convention the States Parties shall have the right to lodge complaints with the Security Council together with a request for their consideration by the Council,
