Mr. Gregg, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copy of Order in Council P.C. 567, approved February 1, 1951: Establishing a National Advisory Council on Manpower to advise the Minister of Labour on matters related to the most effective utilization in the national interest of the present and potential man and woman working force of Canada; with authority to utilize the services of the Unemployment Insurance Commission and its National Employment Services, as well as the national, regional and local Employment Advisory Committees now operating under The Unemployment Insurance Act, 1940; membership of the Council to include representatives of labour, employers, agriculture, women of Canada, veterans of Canada and of various government departments.
