Page 14 of the document indicated the following:

As an initial response to the Report of the Major Projects Task Force, the Government of Canada has established a new Office of Industrial and Regional Benefits.

This is more bureaucracy. What will they do? They will co-ordinate and interact. Page 16 refers to the IOP, the industrial opportunities program, and reads:

To meet the needs of Canadian business in a co-ordinated, effective manner, the Government of Canada will draw together these programs under a new Industrial Opportunities Program (IOP).

This is another mechanism which will necessitate the creation of more jobs for Liberals. At the bottom of page 16 it refers to the establishment of the Canadian Industrial Renewal Board as follows:

The Canadian Industrial Renewal Board is being established to co-ordinate the federal government's industrial adjustment programs in the clothing, textile and footwear sectors.

This is an appointment of some 16 people across the country, all of whom are Liberals, for the purpose of receiving their famous reward. There is only one individual out of the 16 who has had any textile experience. Page 20 refers to the establishment of the Export Trade Development Board. All we have in the document is a proliferation of boards, agencies, advisory councils, Crown corporations and task forces.
