Motor Vehicle Transport Act, 1986

Madam Speaker, and I am not a betting man, especially when I think I might lose.

This amendment would impose a partial safeguard for what the Government told us repeatedly would be in place by next January 1. Everyone in this House knows that it will not be ready by January 1. The implementation of this legislation has to be delayed at least one year, if we are lucky. I hope that the Government will support this motion.
