MATIONAL COMMITTEE FOR THE TRAINING OF TRAUBERS. CENTRAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. MEMORANDUM of PRELIMINARY PROPOSALS towards the INTERCHANGE of SCOTTISH and CANADIAN STUDENT-TEACHERS. I. That as a first stage towards a reciprocal interchange, two student-teacherships should be founded and attached Pespectively in the meantime to Edinburgh and Clasgow Training Centres; that their duties shall be asd goed

student-teacherships should be founded and attached respectively in the meantime to Edinburgh and Clasgow Training Centres; that their duties shall be assigned by the Directors of Studies at these Centres and shall not exceed 10 teaching hours per week; that the holders shall be expected to study at the neighbouring University for the Degree of Ph.D. (or other higher Degree) for which they might be eligible, and to investigate the organisation of, and the methods employed in, Scottish Schools.

(Students who do not present themselves for a Degree shall be required to submit a thesis for the approval of the National Committee.)

- II. That a reciprocal arrangement of appointments with corresponding duties and other pertinent conditions be drafted for the consideration of the selected American and Canadian Universities for Scottish student-teachers proceeding there.
- III. That the value of the student-teacherships held by
 Scottish students shall be £200 per annum, with an
 additional £50 per annum for travelling expenses;
 that they shall be tenable for one year, in the first
 instance, and renewable for a second year to give an
 opportunity for extended study or completion of an
 approved educational investigation on a favourable
 report from the Director of Studies.
