A Letter, said to be from Nova Scotia, having appeared in the Morning Chronicle of June 21, 1784, representing Governor Parr, the Chief Justice, and the Members of the Council, to be *weak, ignorant,* and *designing* men, the affairs of the province unskillfully managed, and the new settlements discouraged, has made the following publication necessary, that Government and the Public may not be misled by bold and unsupported charges from a Junto spread in England, Nova Scotia, and the United States of America. This junto is composed of fifty-five visible persons, “of the most respectable characters, who formerly had great influence in his Majesty’s American dominions,” [if credit is to be given to their own declarations in their letter to Sir Guy Carleton, No. II.] and an invisible Company, of “deeper art and keener policy.”
