PSUDUV, river, rises in the s. side of the co. of Rimouski and traverses the s. w. angle of the co. of Bonaventure, and is one of the early tributaries of the r. Ristigouche.

PYKE RIVER, rises in several small streams that meet near the v. of Freightsburg, in the S. of St. Armand; hence it runs to a village nearly in the centre of Stanbridge and, keeping its very irregular course southwardly, to Bedford village, where it soon regains its n. w. direction, in which it continues till it reaches the 9th range, where it receives a considerable branch from Farnham and turning suddenly southward again it keeps near the w. boundary line till it falls into Missiskoui Bay. At the breaking up of the ice in the spring great numbers of fish are taken

in the mouth of this r. viz., doré, maskinongé, mullet, pike, perch and suckers.—Pyke river turns 5 corn-mills and 6 or 8 saw-mills.

PYKE'S RIVER, in the t. of Frampton, rises in Pyke's Lake, and running n. e. through Pyke's Settlement falls into the r. Etchemin.
