Report of the River Beaudette Drainage Committee.

All the members present.
Your Committee beg leave to report as fol-
lows:

The Court of Revision to hear appeals against
the assessment made by D. R. Brown in this
matter, was held at Alexandria in December
last. All complaints brought before the Court
were heard and considered, resulting in the
dismissal of all the complaints except three;
of these two were modified and one allowed by
the judgment rendered on the 17th December
last. From this judgment a number of ap-
peals were taken to the County Judge, which
appeals were all dismissed by the judgment
rendered on the 24th inst.

Your Committee have concluded the pur-
chase of McLennan's mill dam on Lot 19, 7th
Con., Lancaster, and by deed of conveyance,
all the rights and privileges connected there-
with, together with certain parcels of land,
are now vested in the Municipal Corporation
of these United Counties, the consideration
paid therefor being the sum of eighteen
hundred dollars, which sum it is believed will
be refunded by the Ontario Government.

As the sum placed at the disposal of your
Committee is now exhausted, and several
amounts are still unpaid, your Committee re-
commend that authority be given the Warden
and Treasurer to borrow a sum of money not
to exceed the sum of one thousand dollars,
and that the sum be placed at the disposal of
this Committee.

RE SALARIES.

Your committee have received communica-
tions from the Treasurer and from the Audi-
tors, asking for an increase of salary in each
case. After inquiring carefully into the char-
acter of the work done by and nature of the
duties and services required of the Treasurer,
and having in view in the light of recent ex-
perience, the necessity of having a competent
and thoroughly reliable officer such as the
present Treasurer has proved, we would re-
commend that the salary be increased to \$1,000.
With reference to the Auditors, your com-
mittee are of opinion that the new and im-
proved system of book-keeping will lighten
rather than add to their labors, and that here
no increase will be necessary. We would
therefore recommend that the following sal-
aries be paid, viz:

Treasurer.....	\$ 1000 00
Clerk.....	3 00
Auditors, each.....	60 00
County Engineer, per day while employed.....	6 00
Gaol Physician, drugs included....	225 00
Caretaker.....	200 00
Messenger, including lighting and cleaning Court House.....	50 00
Councillors, per day.....	2 00

Your committee passed accounts amount-
ing to \$1134.76, as shown in schedule A., and
recommend the passing of a by-law for their
payment.

We hereby submit a detailed statement of
the Treasurer's account for the year just
closed, which has been examined and ap-
proved by the Auditors. From this it appears
that the general revenues of the Counties for
the year are derived from five sources and are
as follows, viz:—
