St. Louis Post-Dispatch: In order to prevent wireless messages from inerfering with one another, endeavors have been made to send electrical waves only in one direction, as luminous signals are given off from a concave mirror. Prof. Braun has been engaged in experiments of this kind, and in a lec ture before the Strasburg University Association of Electricians and Naturalists he announced that these experi ment had come to successful conclus on. Prof. Braun's methods are based on the fact that three antennae arranged in the angles of a regular triangle are excited by waves of the same periodity, but of different phases. The inventor states that one of the three antenna begins vibrating by 1-250,000 of a se ond earlier or later than the two others this difference in time being kept up, according to experiments, with an accuracy of about one second in three years. This will result in different radiation, according to the difference of the space, and by simply inverting a crank the direction of maximum effects, can be shifted by 60 or 120 degrees. ForWeddings
